1. Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform

2. Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The [Equality Act 2010](#) prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include age, sex, disability, race, religion or belief, pregnancy and maternity, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will allow for reasonable adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents/carers to get in touch with the Principal, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests. These will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory [guidance](#) from the Department for Education (DfE) on the cost of school uniform.

We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that need to have a school logo or a unique fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents/carers' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers

We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics, where possible. In our school, this is limited to the school jumper, sunhat and PE top. Book bags featuring the school logo are provided to all new pupils upon entry to the school
- Considering alternatives to school-branded items, such as logos that can be added to school jumpers, as long as this doesn't compromise quality and durability
- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveller
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different years/classes/house groups

- Avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- Considering alternative methods for signalling differences in groups for inter-school competitions, such as using bibs supplied by the school
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents/carers to acquire second-hand uniform items
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents/carers of any changes
- Consulting with parents/carers and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy, and carefully considering any complaints about the policy

4. Expectations for school uniform

4.1 Our school's uniform

Launceston Primary School Branded v-necked jumper

White shirt/polo shirt (long or short sleeved)

Black or grey trousers, shorts, pinafore or skirt

Black, safe comfortable shoes or ankle boots (no trainers or high boots)

Plain grey or black tights; or plain white, black, or grey socks

Launceston Primary School branded sunhat

Summer term only:

Green and white checked dresses (with white socks or white / tights)

Non-branded bottle green cardigan permitted with checked dresses.

PE Kit

Black shorts, jogging bottoms or leggings (unbranded)

Launceston Primary School branded PE T-shirt

Black plimsolls or trainers (no studded football boots)

Black hoody or a Launceston Primary School branded hoody

Items to be named and stored in a drawstring PE bag. The Launceston Primary branded bag is optional.

Opal and outdoor learning:

At LPS, we actively encourage outdoor play in all weather. To make the most of this time, it's important that all children are dressed appropriately. Children will need a separate waterproof coat and trousers, wellies and a pair of spare socks to keep them comfortable, dry, and ready for fun. We

understand for the younger child, an all in one puddlesuit might be preferred, but this isn't always best on warmer days. All items can be kept in school, but must be named.

4.2 Where to purchase it

Branded items can be purchased through the Price and Buckland website, all other items can be purchased from any supplier.

Second hand uniform is available from the school office in return for donations to FOLPS

5. Expectations for our school community

5.1 Pupils

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times (other than specified non-school uniform days) while:

- On the school premises
- Travelling to and from school
- At out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school (if required)

Pupils are also expected to contact the Principal if they want to request an adaptation of the uniform policy in relation to their protected characteristics.

5.2 Parents and carers

Parents and carers are expected to make sure their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean
- Clearly labelled with the child's name
- In good condition

Parents/carers are also expected to contact the Principal if they want to request an adaptation of the uniform policy in relation to:

- Their child's protected characteristics
- The cost of the uniform

Parents/carers are expected to lodge any complaints or objections relating to the school uniform in a timely and reasonable manner.

Disputes about the cost of the school uniform will be:

- Resolved locally
- Dealt with in accordance with our school's complaints policy

The school will work closely with parents/carers to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome.

5.3 Staff

Staff will closely monitor pupils to make sure they are in the correct uniform. They will give any pupils and their parents/carers breaching the uniform policy the opportunity to comply, but will follow up with the headteacher if the situation doesn't improve.

Ongoing breaches of our uniform policy will be dealt with by the Principal.

In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a pupil not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation.

5.4 Governors

The governing board will review this policy and make sure that it:

- Is appropriate for our school's context
- Is implemented fairly across the school
- Takes into account the views of parents/carers and pupils
- Offers a uniform that is appropriate, practical and safe for all pupils

The governing body will also make sure that the school's uniform supplier arrangements give the highest priority to cost and value for money, for example, by avoiding single supplier contracts and by re-tendering contracts regularly. The governing body will ensure that information about secondhand uniform is available for parents/carers.
